Smoking isn't allowed in any enclosed workplace, public building, a work vehicle that more than one person uses or on public transport in the UK.

It is also illegal to smoke in a vehicle if you are carrying a passenger under the age of 18 years old, (unless it is a convertible with the roof down). This is to protect children and young people from the dangers of second-hand smoke.





THE LAW DOES NOT APPLY TO

e-cigarettes or to a convertible car with the roof completely down.



COMPANY FINES

All vans or company cars used by more than one person, must display a 'no smoking' sign (in Wales it must be in both Welsh and English). If the sign is not displayed the company can be fined up to £1,000 (England and Wales).



In Scotland, there is a fixed penalty fine of £200, which can go up to £2,500 if the fine isn't paid.
